BOOTS ON THE GROUND KICKS OFF 2023

The 2023 Nevada Legislative Session starts on February 6th. 892 BDRs (Bill Draft Requests) have already been submitted! It's important we make our voices heard. RWR members will review legislation and travel to Carson City in 2023 as Citizen Lobbyists.

Training is Available:

Carol Fineberg, RWR member, and leader of Conservative Talk Lunch (CTL), has a workshop scheduled in February with Janine Hansen, director of Nevada Families for Freedom. Janine has been a Citizen Lobbyist since 1971. According to Chuck Muth: *"She (Janine) not only reads the bills . . . but she has the uncanny ability to root out liberal **poison pill** provisions she finds hidden . . . that would hurt or undermine the conservative cause. And she ain't shy about exposing them"*. Carol has agreed to open her workshop to RWR members as space permits.



RWR MEMBER HISTORY

DID YOU KNOW

- * The yucca, a flowering plant species, belongs to the asparagus family.
- * Over 31.5% of land in France is forest area.
- * Due to covid, women who drink increased their drinking 52%. Women with young children increased their drinking 323%.
- * Italy is the same size as Arizona in square miles. Italy has a population of 55 million. Arizona has 7.25 M.
- * One in 265 children will be diagnosed with cancer before they reach the age of 20.
- * At least 65% of the population is lactose intolerant.
- * Home fire deaths have been on the rise since 2020. Daily, there are 7 deaths, including, on average, one child. There are about 2,620 to 3,000 deaths annually. The top three causes are cooking, heating and electrical.

- * The first person to ever be diagnosed with autism is still alive. Donald Triplett, born in 1933,, had become distant to everyone by age 2. He also has savant abilities; naming musical notes and performs rapid mental multiplication. He graduated from high school in 1958 and graduated with a Bachelor's degree in French. He worked in his family-owned bank. In his spare time, he learned to travel around the world. He is featured in the book, "A Different Key."
