Cindy shared the budget for the coming year, and we voted on it. Kathy presented a Resolution on Election Integrity drafted by Nevada Federation of Republican Women Legislative Chair Yolanda Knaak. We and three other Republican Women's Clubs in Washoe County voted in favor of it and sent it on to all Nevada State Senators, Assemblymen and women, The Governor, Lt. Governor, and Secretary of State.

President's Awardee—Bev Stenehjem





7. Make phone calls to remind people who to vote for, where to vote, etc.


8. Put up candidate signs in your front yard during elections

"Making Your Voice Heard! Election Fairness Workshop" was held on February 26 to a sold out crowd at Paisan's Old Deli in Reno. Washoe County Republican Party Chairman, Michael Kadenacy presented their plan for winning more Republican seats in the Assembly and Senate in 2022. In 2020, we targeted 5 seats and won 4 of them; turning them to Republican office holders.

Washoe County Registrar of Voters, Deanna Spikula spoke to us about the 2020 election and fielded many, many concerns and questions from the audience. She has agreed to come back and conduct a workshop to train us to be poll workers and observers. Eagle Forum President, Janine Hansen and Eagle Forum Vice President, Lynn Chapman presented an update on the "good" and "bad" bills the Nevada Legislature is considering this session. They stressed the need to contact the legislators with our concerns about these bills. Nevada Federation of Republican Women Legislative Chair, Yolanda Candace Knaak gave an update on the Election Integrity Resolution which was sent to all members of the Nevada Legislature. RWR member Carole Fineberg distributed a handout on "How to Effectively Communicate with Your Legislators" and demonstrated how to do so with actually going on the Nevada Legislative website and doing so. We Lived Streamed the workshop and you can go to Youtube and search for RWReno and you will be able to see the presentations. We will be presenting another workshop in March, so stay tuned.

The PAC - What's that all about

The Republican Women of Northern Nevada Political Action Committee, RWNN PAC, was created in 2012 to pool the financial resources of the local Republican Women's Clubs to be more relevant and effective. It was also established because of legal changes made by the legislature and Secretary of State.

Due to the nature of political action committees, there is a certain level of secrecy, which is both strategic and legally required. The exchange of ideas and plans with candidates is considered collusion and is prevented by Nevada state law. Also, it is simply a smart strategy not to publicize one's plans and ideas.

Over the last four election cycles the PAC has received \$168K in funding. Funding is received from several sources: Republican Women's Clubs 42%, outside organizations 35%, individuals 6%, and PAC fundraising events 17%.

Allocations consist of both contributions directly to candidates 53% and independent expenditures 47%. The PAC board must shed itself of all biases and make decisions based on what is best for the state of Nevada, not based on someone's favorite candidate or Washoe County only.

The process for allocating contributions directly to candidates is complex. There are several important questions that need to be researched and answered before a sound decision can be made. 1) Do the statistics of the candidate's district, number of registered republicans vs democrats, make their election possible? 2) Is the candidate working effectively and aggressively to get elected? 3) Does the candidate need the funding? 4) Is the candidate able to fundraise? Basically, are they a good candidate?

While direct candidate contributions impact only one political race, independent expenditures usually benefit multiple candidates. Independent expenditures are made mostly for advertising thru radio, billboards, and internet ads. Allocations have also been made for canvassing, robo calls, slate cards, and walker programs. During the 2018 election cycle in which the PAC advertised on radio, Washoe County voters elected two conservative candidates to the Washoe County School Board. In 2020 the PAC focused its advertising efforts using billboards to get out the vote (GOTV) for republicans. The feedback on these methods was extremely positive.

Political action committees are required, by law, to file with the Nevada Secretary of State. These reports on Contributions and Expenditures can be found on the SOS website.

Hopefully, this information has helped you understand how political action committees operate and why the RWNN PAC is so important and effective in getting republicans elected. Of the six candidates we focused on in 2020, both in Washoe and Clark Counties, four won and one lost by only a few hundred votes. Please address any questions to bkirk@charter.net.

81st SESSION OF THE NEVADA LEGISLATURE:
WASHOE REPUBLICAN WOMEN'S CLUBS ENDORSE RESOLUTION ON
ELECTION INTEGRITY

Every year that the Nevada Legislature is in session (i.e., odd years), it is customary for Republican Women's clubs to send Resolution(s) on critical issues of importance to the legislators. This year, Nevada Federation of Republican Women (NvFRW) Legislative Chair Yolanda Knaak has drafted a very comprehensive Resolution on Election Integrity calling for a forensic audit of the voting machines used in Nevada. The Resolution has been approved by the member bodies of four Washoe County Republican clubs: Incline Village/Crystal Bay, Mt. Rose, RWR, and Sparks. Below is a text of the Resolution along with a copy of the cover letter signed by the four club Presidents. The Resolution and letter lay out a strong case for voter reform.

The week of February 15, the Resolution and letter were emailed to all State Senators and Assemblymen and women, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, and the Washoe and Clark County Commissioners. Hard copies of both were printed and hand carried by Assemblyman Jim Wheeler to all legislators.

We've received some positive responses from some of our Republican legislators, which are also included below. Even though we Republicans are still a minority, it is imperative that we fight back and make our voices heard.

RWR is proud to have been a signatory to this Resolution.

RESOLUTION FOR ELECTION INTEGRITY

Written by Yolanda Candace Knaak, Incline Village/Crystal Bay Republican Women, Legislative Chair

WHEREAS, In light of the fact that voter confidence in the legitimacy of the last presidential election is lower than any other presidential election in the modern history of our nation; and

WHEREAS, The State of Texas used voting machines in the past and found irregularities in the votes; and

WHEREAS, It is very important that every legal vote is counted without dilution by fraudulent votes; and

WHEREAS, It is essential that we not move forward without having a forensic audit of all the 2020 voting machines, their software and the paper ballots. We need a forensic audit not by the companies that recommended the voting machines' use in the 2020 election, but by two unbiased companies. Each of companies must perform the forensic audit independently; and

WHEREAS, These companies must evaluate all the voting machines, the software, the paper ballots and recount the 2020 votes via forensic audit to give the voters confidence in the election results; and

WHEREAS, Sending out ballots to everyone, whether they request them or not, is another way to promote voter fraud; and

WHEREAS, In the 2020 election, ballots were mailed to people who had moved out of state or had died; and

WHEREAS, Ballots should be mailed only to people who request them; and

WHEREAS, Because another proven way to commit voter fraud is with ballot harvesting, the law must require that all ballots be turned in before the polls close on Election Day, except ballots submitted by deployed military; and

WHEREAS, Every citizen who cares enough to take the time to vote should also care enough to obtain the most basic form of identification, or to request assistance to obtain some minimal identification to protect the integrity of a process for which others have laid down their lives; and

WHEREAS, Nevada Republican Women are aware that many elections here and elsewhere are often decided by a handful of votes and that therefore, it is crucially important to do all that is reasonable to impart confidence to the legal voter that his or her vote does in fact count and makes a real difference in an election;

Now therefore, be IT *RESOLVED*, That Nevada Republican Women support an evaluation of all the voting machines, their software and the paper ballots, and a recount of votes after a forensic audit. We are requesting reasonable measures to safeguard the integrity of our elections by ensuring that everyone who votes actually has the right to vote; and

BE IT FURTHER *RESOLVED*, That Nevada Republican Women pledge their support for any state and/or national legislation which thoughtfully, prudently and reasonably promotes the integrity of our elections. This includes accurate non-fraudulent machines, software and paper ballots, mailing ballots only to those who request them, issuing voter identification which is readily accessible to all voters and banning ballot harvesting.

I am committed to fighting for election reform and redressing the loss of trust in our democratic republic process. The 32nd Special Session of our Legislature eroded one of our Country's most sacred Rights, the Right to Vote! Mere hours before the hearing on election reform Secretary of State (SOS) Cegavske and Republican legislators had a 64-page-bill (AB4) plopped on their laps. SOS Cegavske testified that we had one of the safest and most accessible voting systems in the country, nothing needed to be fixed, and that anyone who wanted to vote by mail could easily and safely do so. Subject: Resolution for Election Integrity

Dear Assemblywoman Benitez-Thompson:

We represent four very active Republican Women's clubs in Northern Nevada: Incline Village/Crystal Bay Republican Women, Mt. Rose Republican Women, Republican Women of Reno, and Sparks Republican Women. We are presenting the attached Joint Resolution on Election Integrity for your action, as this is our issue of priority concern for the 81st Nevada Legislature.

Immediately after the 2020 General Election, the Nevada Republican Party started receiving thousands of complaints about incidents of irregularities, both with the human handling of mail-in ballots and the machine counting of ballots. Moreover, the Nevada Supreme Court denied to even investigate the issue of election fraud when presented with boxes full of evidence and testimonies. How can anyone be confident that there was no voter fraud, when there was no investigation? The only thing that came out was citizens testifying that they observed fraudulent voting?

In addition, during the Senate hearing on February 9 about election integrity in the 2020 election, Trump lawyer Jesse Binnell dropped shocking facts about Nevada's fraud:

- 42k people voted more than once
- 1.5k dead people voted
- 19k didn't live in NV
- 8k voted from a non-existent address
- 15k registered to a commercial address
- 4k non-citizens voted

Election integrity is the most pressing issue right now not only with our clubs, but to the rest of Nevada and the entire country. If our citizens cannot be guaranteed that their votes will be counted fairly and our elections transparent, then our very democracy is at stake, and voters will never have a voice again in choosing our government leaders. This goes for Democrats, Republicans, Independents, and all other parties.

We ask that you, as an elected representative of the citizens of Nevada, act upon the Resolution attached and carry or vote in favor of bills that would provide evaluations on all 2020 voting machines, their software and paper ballots via forensic audit. We are requesting two unbiased companies do the forensic audit separately. Plus, please carry or vote in favor of bills that will promote election integrity in future elections. Only in that way can all voters in Nevada be assured that future elections are conducted fairly and transparently, and that faith in the electoral process, which is now dangerously low, can be restored.

NVGOP Links to Voter Fraud Info – 2020 General Election

Categories of mail-in ballot fraud – these are all actual ballots cast:

- 42,284 duplicate votes cast by voters with matching name, address and birthdate
- 15,164 out of state votes (non-student, non-military)
- 8,842 votes from commercial addresses
- 3,463 votes from vacant properties
- 3,262 votes from non-existent addresses (vacant lots, etc.)
- 2,468 votes from voters who have permanently changed their residence address to another state
- 1,506 votes from deceased voters
- 3,987 votes from non-US citizens

Each of these 80,976 cast votes ties back to a specific voter record, and these details were included in the 8,000 pages of evidence filed with the district and Nevada Supreme courts by the Nevada GOP.






